General Instructions and Information

Explanation: Last year, the taxes on your home were reduced by the owner-occupancy reduction (2.5% on qualified levies) allowed by law for owner-occupied homes under the name of the previous owner. That reduction will reduce the property tax bills that are paid on the home during this calendar year. In order to receive the reduction for this tax year (taxes actually paid next calendar year), you must complete this form and return it to the county auditor by the first Monday in June, if the home still qualifies.

Qualifications: To receive the owner-occupancy homestead tax reduction, you must own and occupy your home as your principal place of residence (domicile) on Jan. 1 of the year you file for the reduction. A homeowner and spouse are entitled to this homestead tax reduction on only one home

in Ohio, unless they can establish that they are domiciled separately. A person only has one principal place of residence. Your principal place of residence determines, among other things, where you are registered to vote and where you declare residency for income tax purposes.

Instructions: The line after Auditor's Number is for the auditor only; do not write on it. The lines following Parcel Number and Tax District are for the parcel number of your home and for the taxing district in which it is located. If these lines are not already completed, both of these can be found on your tax bill. If you cannot locate them, contact your county auditor. In the lines following Name of Owner(s) of the Home, list the names of all the owners. If all the names are not on your tax bill, list the names as they appear on the deed to your home.
